GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of township 26 south, range 3 west,
pertaining to the previously described resurvey, is
located in the valley drained by the North Umpqua River,
in Douglas County, about 2 miles east of the town of
Glide, Oregon. The elevations range from about 700 feet
above sea level along the North Umpqua River to about
1,100 feet above sea level near the southeast corner of
section 9.

Access into the area is by way of the North Umpqua
Highway, a paved highway which follows along the north
bank of the river and a gravelled road which follows
along the south bank of the river.
