"T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with an aluminum washer mkd. RLS 239, with a sandstone, 16 x 10 x 6 ins., with 5 notches on E., and 3 notches on S. face, firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, alongside, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p>A cedar, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 9½° E., 24½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T BT visible on decayed blaze.
