	<p>From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 14 and 23, perpetuated and recorded by Lorne Swearingen, Registered Engineer No. 4186, in 1960; monumented with a steel rod, 7/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, alongside of which is a broken basalt stone, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p>A ponderosa pine snag, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 40½° E., 50 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S BT visible on opened double blaze. (Record, S. 42° E.)</p> <p>and bearing trees mkd. by Swearingen</p> <p>A madrone, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 40½° E., 26 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S 4186 BT visible on partially healed double blaze.</p> <p>A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 19° E., 66 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S 4186 BT visible on partially healed double blaze.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T 32 S R 8 W ¼ $\frac{S 14}{S 23}$ 1975</p> <p>Deposit remains of stone and reset steel rod alongside iron post.</p> <p>N. 89° 54' W., bet. secs. 14 and 23.</p> <p>Descend 90 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p> <p>7.60 Ravine, drains S. 15° E.; asc. 370 ft. over SE. slope.</p>
