Land, rolling hills.  
Soil, sandy clay loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, madrone, oak, dogwood, and chinquapin; undergrowth, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, rhododendron, and blackberry.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 19, township 22 south, range 7 west is located about one mile north of Elkton, Oregon. Access into the area is by way of a privately owned dirt road from Elkton. The area is very dry, with only a few small tributaries of the Umpqua River to the south. Elevations range from about 300 feet above sea level near the ¼ section corner of sections 19 and 20, to about 640 feet above sea level near the northeast corner of Donation Land Claim No. 41.

Section 19 is heavily timbered and is used for timber harvesting. The adjacent lands in Donation Land Claims Nos. 39 and 41, are used to pasture cattle. The timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, maple, alder, dogwood, madrone, cascara, and chinquapin. The undergrowth is hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, vine maple, poison oak, salmonberry, Oregon grape, blackberry, rhododendron, and fern.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted in the course of the resurvey.

A number of readings throughout the area gives a mean magnetic declination of 20° 28' E., with a variation of 0° 30' due to local attraction.
