Timber, madrone, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, and chinquapin; undergrowth, blackberry, elderberry, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry, fern, rhododendron, scotch broom, poison oak, devil's club, salal, Oregon grape, arrowwood, salmonberry, and thimbleberry.

N. 89° 44' W., bet. secs. 15 and 22.

Descend 180 ft. along S. slope, through dense timber
and undergrowth.

4.20 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears S. 55° E. and N. 55° W.

6.40 Ravine, drains S. 30° W.; desc. 130 ft. over W. slope.

14.25 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S. 50° E., in curve.

14.80 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 10° W.; asc. 130 ft. over
NE. slope.
