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| <p>CHAINS 50.99</p> | <p>The original closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, monumented with an iron rod, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam., firmly set, projecting 17 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p>A sawed fir stump, 54 ins. diam., bears N. 77° E., 15 lks. dist., with scribe mark 5 visible on opened blaze.</p> <p>A root hole, bears S. 74° E., 57 lks. dist.</p> <p>and a bearing tree mkd. by the County Surveyor (date unknown)</p> <p>A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 8° W., 36 lks. dist., with healed blaze.</p> <p>Bury iron rod at original corner position.</p> <p>Ascend slightly along W. slope.</p> |
| <p>51.06</p> | <p>Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 19 S., R. 7 W.</p> <p>True point for the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T 19 S R 7 W S 35 S 2 S 1 T 20 S R 7 W C C 1977</p> </div> <p>from which</p> <p>A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 59° E., 76 lks. dist., mkd. T20S R7W S1 CC BT.</p> <p>A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 64½° W., 141 lks. dist., mkd. T20S R7W S2 CC BT.</p> <p>Set a 5 ft. steel fence post alongside iron post.</p> <p>From this point, the cor. of secs. 35 and 36 only, T. 19 S., R. 7 W., bears S. 89° 36' E., 13.12 chs. dist., hereinbefore described.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, maple, alder, dogwood, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrow-wood, huckleberry, blackberry, salmonberry, Oregon grape, salal, and fern.</p> |
| <p>13.06</p> | <p>To complete the survey of sec. 1, I return to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36 only, T. 19 S., R. 7 W., and run</p> <p>N. 89° 53' W., on the N. bdy. of sec. 1.</p> <p>Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, at midpoint on the N. bdy. of sec. 1.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 3½ ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> |
