CHAINS

A sawed and burned fir stump, 48 ins. diam., bears
S. 52° E., 41 lks. dist., with scribe marks
W 1/16 S15 BT visible on open blaze.

S. 89° 50' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 40 ft. over SW. slope.

2.90 Haney Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S. 65° E.; asc. 80 ft.
over NE. slope.

10.30 Spur, slopes N. 20° E.; desc. 30 ft. along N. slope.

15.00 Haney Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 60° E.; asc. 80 ft.
over SE. slope.

19.75 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, monumented with an
iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins.
above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed and burned maple stump, 21 ins. diam.,
bears S. 32° W., 27½ lks. dist., with scribe
marks T20S R visible on open blaze.

Vegetation, young timber, vine maple, willow, hazel,
arrowwood, manzanita, ceanothus, blackberry, Oregon
grape, salal, and fern.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 5, determined from
the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears N. 52° E., 38 lks. dist., with
a down and decayed fir stump alongside, 36 ins.
diam., no marks visible.

A root hole, bears S. 88° W., 16 lks. dist., with
a down fir alongside, 48 ins. diam., with scribe
marks ¼ S visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
