CHAINS

Set a brass tablet, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., $3\frac{1}{2}$ ins. stem, in drill hole, in rock ledge, at base of small bluff, facing NW., with top mkd.

A maple, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $19\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 58 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 BT.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 75 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 BT.

Descend 5 ft. over NW. slope.

42.40 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° E.; asc. 270 ft. over broken NE. slope.

55.10 Spur, slopes N. 10° E.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.

57.35 Ravine, drains N. 25° E.; asc. 190 ft. over NE. slope.

65.70 Spur, slopes N. 10° E.; desc. 75 ft. over NW. slope.

68.90 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 25° E.; asc. 160 ft. over NE. slope.

74.85 Spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. 75 ft. over broken NW. slope.

81.36 The cor. of secs. 32 and 33 only, perpetuated and recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed fir stump, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 42 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A sawed fir stump, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 86° E., 45 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A sawed fir stump, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 43° W., 38 lks. dist., with chaining notch visible on decayed blaze.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Godfrey

A sawed cedar stump, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 75° E., $56\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 54 ins. diam., bears N. $75\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 99 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A maple, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 77° E., 155 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R4W S33 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, alder, myrtle, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, and fern.
