The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 27 and 28, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1965, monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A root crown, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 89° E., 47 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A sawed fir stump, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 63° W., 48 lks. dist., with chaining notch visible on open blaze.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 54° E., 8 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 40° W., 14 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

From this point, a 1 in. "T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, bears S. 65° W., 0.45 chs. dist.

N. $1^\circ 50'$ W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 80 ft. over broken NE. slope.

8.15 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 70° W.; asc. 190 ft. over broken SW. slope.

17.00 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 110 ft. over NW. slope.

20.55 Ravine, drains N. 75° W.; asc. 180 ft. over broken SW. slope.

32.45 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 75 ft. over NW. slope.

37.20 Ravine, drains S. 80° W.; asc. 20 ft. over SW. slope.

39.76 The cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27, and 28, perpetuated and recorded by Bruce A. Shaner, Registered Land Surveyor No. 430, in 1974, from testimony of local land owners and at the intersection of very old fence lines extending N., S., and W. This position is accepted as the best available evidence of the original corner, and is monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
