The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, perpetuated and recorded by H. J. Eppstein, County Surveyor, in 1932, from original evidence no longer in existence, and further perpetuated by Milo Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A white oak, 32 ins. diam., bears N. 9° E., 136½ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 28° E., 364 lks. dist., with scribe marks T2 R4W CS BT visible on open blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Godfrey

An ash, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 28° W., 27½ lks. dist., with scribe marks 4W S32 visible on open blaze.

and a bearing tree of which I have no record

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 54° E., 139 lks. dist., with a nail with "W" embossed on head, at base.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, myrtle, chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, rhododendron, hazel, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33, and 34.

S. 89° 35' W., bet. secs. 28 and 33.

Descend 35 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

5.90 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 50° W.; desc. 20 ft. over SW. slope, along creek bottom.

15.50 Same creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 25° W.; desc. 10 ft. over SW. slope, along creek bottom.

18.20 Gravelled road, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 35° W. and S. 35° E.

18.75 Elk Creek, 30 lks. wide, course N. 40° W.; asc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.

39.66 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 33, perpetuated and recorded by Milo Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with a 1 in. "T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with an aluminum washer mkd. RLS 239, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 44 ins. diam., bears N. 15° E., 50 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.
