from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A root hole, bears N. 26½° E., 39 lks. dist., with a down yew alongside, 12 ins. diam., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

A fir stump, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 44½° W., 63 lks. dist., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

and the remains of an original line tree

A fir snag, 55 ins. diam., bears North, 30 lks. dist., with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

and bearing trees mkd. by White and Beck, in 1963

A yew, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 43½° E., 54 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

A grand fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 22½° E., 146 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A yew, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 68° W., 25 lks. dist., with scribe marks T23S R5W S25 BT visible on open blaze.

A grand fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 53° W., 44 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and new bearing trees

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 89° E., 12½ lks. dist., mkd. T23S R4W S19 BT.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 21¼° E., 9 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R4W S30 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, myrtle, maple, oak, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, vine maple, poison oak, hazel, Oregon grape, and fern.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, perpetuated by person(s) unknown, monumented with a 1 in. "T" shaped iron rod, firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 37 lks. dist., with axe marks visible on open and burned blaze.

A fir snag, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 3 lks. dist., with chaining notch visible on open and burned blaze.
