## CHAINS

from which bearing trees mkd. by Corbin

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 5° E., 105½ lks.  
dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 157 lks.  
dist., with healed blaze.

From this same point, the cor. of secs. 3 and 4 only, on  
the N. bdy. of sec. 9, bears S. 88° 44' W., 1.07 chs.  
dist.

The original closing cor. of secs. 9 and 10, perpetuated  
and recorded by Ben Irving, County Surveyor, in 1929,  
and further perpetuated by H. L. Eppstein, County Sur-  
veyor, in 1935, monumented with an iron pipe, 2 ins.  
diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, from  
which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir stump, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 80½° E., 48  
lks. dist., with scribe marks T27S R2W S  
visible on open blaze.

A fir root crown, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 63½° W.,  
120 lks. dist.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Eppstein

A pine, stump, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 13½° E.,  
20 lks. dist., with scribe marks CS S3 T27  
visible on open blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 17° E., 80 lks.  
dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible  
on open blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 72½° W.,  
108 lks. dist., with scribe marks CS S4 T27S R2  
visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 74° W.)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, and  
alder; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, poison oak, hazel,  
and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 3 and 4 only.

N. 1° 12' E., bet. secs. 3 and 4.

Ascend 125 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and  
dense undergrowth.

Paved road, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 40° E. and S. 40° W.

Top of ascent, slopes E., also south edge of circular  
water storage tank, 29 ft. diam., no longer in use, on  
line; desc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.
