CHAINS

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 46° W., 57½ lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S26 BT.

Deposit corner stone alongside iron post.

N. 1° 07' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 10 ft. over N. slope.

0.10 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 80° W.; asc. 325 ft. over SW. slope.

15.05 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 945 ft. over NW. slope.

37.64 The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A live oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 21½° E., 37 lks. dist., with scribe marks T31S R8W S24 CS BT visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 15° E.) (Remarked by Byron)

A maple, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 65° E., 31 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 35 lks.)

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 25 lks. dist., with scribe marks T31S R8W S BT visible on bark blaze. (Record, S. 55° W.)

A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 23° W., 38½ lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 28° W., 45 lks.)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, alder, myrtle, live oak, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, rhododendron, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, County Surveyor, in 1966, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
