lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record,
N. 65° W., 98 lks.)

A decayed sugar pine stump, 10 ins. diam., bears
N. $37\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 16 lks. dist., with a down pine
alongside, with scribe marks T31S R8W S27 BT
visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 41° E.)

A sugar pine, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 76° E., 41
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. $82\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 32 lks.
dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. $78\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.)

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., $26\frac{1}{2}$ lks.
dist., mkd. T31S R8W S27 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, myrtle, alder,
live oak, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak,
vine maple, Oregon grape, hazel, rhododendron, and fern.
