CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisional lines, township 23 south, range 9 west, Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

The history of surveys pertaining to this resurvey, is as follows:

The south and west boundaries and a portion of the subdivisional lines were surveyed by William H. Byars, in 1878-79.

A portion of the north, south, east, and west boundaries was retraced, and the survey of the subdivisional lines was completed by Oscar F. Thiel, in 1898-99.

A portion of the west boundary was dependently resurveyed by Donald R. Beck, in 1967.

A portion of the subdivisional lines was dependently resurveyed by James E. Jelley and Rolla R. Steward, in 1969-70.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and Special Instructions, dated February 11, 1977, under Group Number 927, Oregon.

The directions of the lines were determined by deflections from azimuths obtained by direct solar observations.

Preliminary to the resurvey, the lines of the original survey were retraced and search was made for all corners and other calls of the record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions. Lost corners were reestablished and remonumented at proportionate positions based on the official record. The retracement data were thoroughly verified and only the true line field notes are given herein. All lines not forming a closure were measured twice. Only those lines bounding or crossing public lands were blazed.

The geographic position of the corner of sections 27, 28, 33, and 34, as scaled from the Scottsburg, Oregon quadrangle map, published by the United States Geological Survey, in 1955, is as follows:

Latitude 43° 31.9' N. Longitude 123° 45.9' W.

The mean magnetic declination is 19° 53' E.
