CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay.
Timber, fir, hemlock, alder, chinquapin, maple, cedar,
and yew; undergrowth, hazel, rhododendron, huckleberry,
willow, salmonberry, blackberry, salal, Oregon grape,
and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30.

N. 0° 19' W., bet. secs. 19 and 20.

Ascend 20 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.

- 2.30 Spur, slopes N. 70° E.; desc. 180 ft. over NE. slope.
- 9.30 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 40° E.; asc. 20 ft. over
NE. slope.
- 12.70 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 155 ft. over NE. slope.
- 22.05 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; continue along
nearly level bottom land.
- 37.00 Soup Creek Road, asphalt surfaced, 35 lks. wide, bears
N. 40° E. and S. 40° W.
- 38.60 Soup Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 30° W.; asc. 5 ft.
over nearly level ground.
- 39.34 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, monumented with an
iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins.
above ground, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area covered in this resurvey is located
approximately 10 miles south of Scottsburg, Oregon, near
the area of Ash Valley. Access into the area is by way
of a county road leading from Oregon State Highway No.
38, southerly, into the Ash Valley area. Several dirt
and gravelled roads branch off this main road into the
sections surveyed.
