| GENERAL DESCRIPTION | |
| <p>Section 35, township 30 south, range 7 west, is located about 7 miles southwesterly from the town of Riddle, Oregon. The area is broken and mountainous, with elevations ranging from about 750 feet above sea level on Cow Creek near the S 1/16 section corner of sections 35 and 36, to about 1800 feet above sea level on a ridge in the SW$\frac{1}{4}$ of the section. The area is drained by Cow Creek and its tributaries. Soil is a rocky clay loam. The area is forested with fir, hemlock, maple, pine, alder, myrtle, cedar, and chinquapin, with undergrowth of vine maple, salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, hazel, fern, and rhododendron.</p> <p>Access is gained by way of Cow Creek Road and a number of gravelled and dirt logging roads extending from it into the area.</p> <p>There were no mineral deposits noted in the area.</p> <p>The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the area resurveyed gives a value of 18° 22' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° 42' in local attraction.</p> | |
