

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines,
T. 33 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 63 lks. dist., mkd. T33S R7W S8 BT. This tree also has scribe marks RS 901 BT visible on SW. face.

From this point, a point established and recorded by Max W. Hull, Registered Land Surveyor No. 901, in 1973, bears West, 0.964 chs. dist., monumented with an iron rod, 5/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with plastic cap mkd. HULL RS 901, from which bearing trees mkd. by Hull

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 71½° E., 37½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S9 RS 901 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A madrone, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 27° E., 17½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S16 RS 901 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A madrone, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 19¾° W., 59 lks. dist., with scribe marks S17 RS 901 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A live oak, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 36¼° W., 35½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S8 RS 901 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, oak, madrone, and chinquapin; undergrowth, poison oak, huckleberry, manzanita, hazel, chaparral, salal, and Oregon grape.

From the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, perpetuated and recorded by John M. Powell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1968, monumented with an iron pipe, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A madrone, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 15 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 10° W., 28 lks. dist. The tree was rescribed by Powell with scribe marks T33S R7W S16 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 53° E., 26½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T33S R7W S10 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A black oak, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 8½° E., 45 lks. dist., with scribe marks T33S R7W S15 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.
