

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines,
T. 25 S., R. 1 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

from which

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. $31\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 42 lks. dist., mkd. 120 1/16 S19 BT.

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., bears S. $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 42 lks. dist., mkd. 120 1/16 S30 BT.

Ascend 230 ft. over NE. slope.

Intersect the E. bdy. of sec. 24, T. 25 S., R. 2 W.

The closing cor. of secs. 19 and 30, hereinbefore described.

From this point, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 24 only, T. 25 S., R. 2 W., bears N. $0^{\circ} 12'$ W., 7.12 chs. dist., hereinbefore described.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, alder, madrone, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, perpetuated and recorded by Burton W. Holt, Registered Land Surveyor No. 418, in 1960, monumented with an iron pipe, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A root hole, bears S. 57° W., 40 lks. dist., with a down yew alongside, 9 ins. diam., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Holt

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., $51\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 85° E., $25\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 74° W., $35\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., $29\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
