- 19.95 Spur, slopes N. 80° W.; desc. 55 ft. over NW. slope.
- 21.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 70° W.; asc. 40 ft. over SW. slope.
- 23.60 Top of ascent, slopes N. 70° W.; desc. 140 ft. over NW. slope.
- 33.80 Little Wolf Creek, 15 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 190 ft. over SE. slope.
- 35.25 Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.
- 39.68 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A root hole, bears N. 75° E., 65 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, size indeterminate, with scribe marks 8 W visible on open blaze.

A fir, 21 ins. diam., bears S. 5° E., 46 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 51 lks.)

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 41° W., 23 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 80° E., 79 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 66 3/4° W., 69 lks. dist., with scribe marks S S B visible on partially healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, hemlock, chinquapin, alder, maple, and dogwood; undergrowth, poison oak, manzanita, fern, blackberry, vine maple, hazel, willow, Oregon grape, salal, huckleberry, arrowwood, and wild rose.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11.

S. 89° 43' W., bet. Secs. 3 and 10.

Descend 15 ft. over SW. slope, along gravelled road.

- 2.10 Leave gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 75° W. and S. 75° E.; enter heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 5.10 Bottom of descent, slopes S.; asc. 90 ft. over SE. slope.
