CHAINS

A fir snag, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 48 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 visible on opened double blaze.

A fir snag, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 39° E., 50 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on decayed blaze. (Record, hemlock)

and bearing trees mkd. by Quimby

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 19 1/2° E., 7 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S18 BT visible on open double blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 73 1/4° E., 18 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S19 BT visible on open double blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 75 1/2° W., 10 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S18 BT visible on open blaze.

From this point, the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19, erroneously positioned by Sams and Harris, in 1971, bears N. 87° 49' W., 1.72 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record. I remove the iron post and destroy the marks on the bearing tree.

West, beginning new measurement.

Ascend 105 ft. over NE. slope.

- 2.50 Ravine, drains N. 60° E.; asc. slightly over NE. slope.
- 7.15 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 80 ft. over NW. slope
- 11.80 Ravine, drains N. 40° E.; asc. 545 ft. over SE. slope.
- 28.50 Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 65° W. and S. 65° E.
- 31.57 The cor. of secs. 18 and 19 only, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1968, and further perpetuated and recorded by Romano E. Ware, Registered Land Surveyor No. 1005, in 1977, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
