GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of the township that was resurveyed is located about 17 miles southeast of the town of Glide, Oregon. The area is drained by Little River which runs in a westerly direction through the township, and White Creek which flows northerly through sections 18 and 19. The main access into the area is via Little River Road, and numerous other gravelled and dirt logging roads. The elevation varies from about 1900 feet above sea level on White Creek, to about 2800 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 18 and 19 only, on the west boundary of the township.

The soil is generally a rocky clay and supports a heavy growth of timber consisting of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, madrone, maple, dogwood, and oak. The undergrowth is primarily vine maple, willow, rhododendron, salal, huckleberry, fern, poison oak, and young timber.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted during the course of the resurvey.

The average of a number of readings over all parts of the resurvey gives a value of 20° 00' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a variance of 1° 30' due to local attraction.
