## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located in Douglas County, about 11 miles southeasterly from the town of Glide, Oregon. Access is by way of Cavitt Creek Road, with several unimproved logging roads extending westerly into section 22.

The area is drained by several small creeks draining into Cavitt Creek which flows northerly. Elevations range from about 1360 feet above sea level, near the S 1/16 section corner of sections 21 and 22, to about 2000 feet above sea level, at the corner of sections 21, 22, 27, and 28.

The soil is composed generally of rocky clay loam, and supports abundant stands of timber and undergrowth in the upper regions. Timber consists mainly of fir, oak, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, and ash. The undergrowth consists primarily of salal, vine maple, rhododendron, poison oak, Oregon grape, and fern.

No evidence of mineral deposits were noted along the lines surveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area resurveyed gives a value of 18° 30' E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 0° 30' in local attraction.
