CHAINS

The following field notes describe the remonumentation of certain original corner points, township 21 south, range 6 west, Willamette Meridian, Oregon as provided for in the General Special Instructions, Group Number 350, Oregon, dated May 3, 1957, "Investigation of Collateral or Physical Evidence of Corner Positions and Accessories, Followed by Remonumentation of Corner Points, with New Accessories when Needed."

The remonumentations were made at the request of the Roseburg District Manager, for administrative purposes of the Bureau of Land Management.

The mean magnetic declination is 20° E.

Subdivisions, T. 21 S., R. 6 W.,  
Willamette Meridian, Oregon

(Remonumenting corners established by William P. Wright,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1884)

The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, perpetuated and recorded by Wilford Haines, Registered Land Surveyor No. 239, in 1961, monumneted with a T shaped iron rod, 1 in. cross section, firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, from which the remaining original bearing trees:

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 80° E., 60 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

A fir, 56 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 17 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Haines

A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 46° E., 24 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

A hemlock, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 36 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Reset T shaped iron rod alongside iron post.

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 14 and 15, perpetuated and recorded by Milo Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A decayed hemlock stump, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 53° E., 18 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on decayed blaze.
