A burned laurel snag, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 50° E., 106 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A black oak snag, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 67 1/2° W., 57 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Godfrey

A madrone, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 12° E., 91 lks. dist., with scribe marks 24S R6W S34 CS B visible on open blaze.

A madrone, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 4 1/2° W., 110 lks. dist., with scribe marks 4S R6W S33 visible on partially healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 60° W., 203 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree and a reference monument

An iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., set 24 ins. in the ground, for a reference monument, bears N. 35° E., 20 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. T24S R6W S27 RM 20 LKS 1979 and an arrow pointing to the corner.

A madrone, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 82° W., 28 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

Corner is located in a woven wire fence line, extending E. and W.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, oak, alder, hemlock, ash, and maple; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, blackberry, thimbleberry, huckleberry, hawthorne, fern, Oregon grape, wild rose, arrowwood, hazel, and young timber.

N. 0° 15' E., bet. secs. 27 and 28.

Ascend 40 ft. over broken SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.75 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 245 ft. over NW slope.

19.50 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 40° E. and S. 40° W.
