A fir snag, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 55° E., 126 lks dist., no marks visible.

A root hole, bears S. 88° E., 89 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 40 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A sugar pine snag, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 28° W., 75 lks. dist., with scribe mark T visible on opened blaze.

A sawed sugar pine stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 24° W., 91 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 35 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A sugar pine. 16 ins. diam., bears S. 78° E., 52 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 60° W., 12 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A sugar pine, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 19 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks T32S R7W S8 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, oak, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth, poison oak, manzanita, hazel, huckleberry, blackberry, ceanothus, Oregon grape, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29, perpetuated and recorded by Norman D. Price, Registered Land Surveyor No. 33, in 1956, and further perpetuated and recorded by John M. Powell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with a galvanized iron pipe, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears S. 10° E., 37 lks. dist., with a down burned and decayed madrone alongside, 18 ins. diam., no marks visible. (Record, 32 lks.)

A sawed and decayed ponderosa pine stump, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 25° W., 84 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on bark. (Record, 90 lks.)
