CHAINS

and bearing trees mkd. by Powell

A live oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 71° E., 23 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 32S R7W S20 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 25° E., 40 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 22 1/2° W., 40 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 55 1/2° W., 33 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, oak, yew, and maple; undergrowth, poison oak, manazita, ceanothus, hazel, huckleberry, blackberry, alder, dogwood, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, determined from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears N. 45° E., 53 lks. dist., (Record, N. 35° E.)

A root hole, bears S. 37° W., 90 lks. dist., with a down and decayed fir alongside, 48 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 55° W., 135 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on burned bark blaze. (Record, N. 52° W., 146 lks.)

and the remains of bearing trees of which I have no record

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 17° E., 58 lks. dist., with scribe marks 2968 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 2° E., 60 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze, with a down fir alongside, 14 ins. diam., with scribe marks 2968 visible on open blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 50 1/2° W., 50 lks. dist., mkd. T32S R7W S19 BT.
