	<p>From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 4, monumented with the remains of the original corner tree, a hemlock snag, 25 ins. diam., with scribe marks 1/4 S visible on opened blaze on W. face, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A hemlock snag, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 7° E., 17 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S BT visible on partially healed blaze and 1/4 S3 BT visible on another partially healed blaze.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A hemlock snag, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 37° W., 28 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S visible on partially healed blaze. (Record, 38 lks.)</p> <p>and the remains of bearing tree and a reference monument mkd. by Jelley</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A hemlock snag, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 63° W., 27 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S4 BT visible on partially healed blaze.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">An iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, bears N. 13° W., 4 1/2 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. T33S R4W 1/4 S4 RM 1962 and an arrow pointing to the corner.</p> <p>and new bearing trees</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 48 1/2° E., 83 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S3 BT.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 12 1/2° W., 16 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S4 BT.</p> <p>N. 0° 08' E., bet secs. 3 and 4.</p> <p>Descend 50 ft. over NE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
2.50	Last Chance Creek, 5 lks wide, course S. 70° E.; asc. 120 ft. over SW. slope.
10.00	Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 20 ft. along broken W. slope.
15.25	Bottom of descent, slopes W.; asc. 150 ft. over broken SW. slope.
24.93	An original line tree, a fir snag, 50 ins. diam., mkd. with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
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	N. 0° 42' E., beginning new measurement.
	Ascend 150 ft. over SW. slope.
9.365	Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 4 W., (Seventh Standard Parallel South).
