CHAINS

From this point, the former standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 34, changed to an angle point by Chapman and Nicklin, in 1897, bears S. 89° 41' E., 24.315 chs. dist., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 4 W., executed concurrently under this same group.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 5, perpetuated and recorded by the Douglas County Surveyors Office, in 1970, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed cedar stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 45° E., 59 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 23° W., 35 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened and burned blaze.

A cedar, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 21° E., 55 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S4 DCS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 82° W., 36 lks. dist., with pitched over partially healed blaze.

North, bet. secs. 4 and 5.

Descend 120 ft. over NW slope, through medium timber and dense undergrowth, along W. edge of logged area.

4.95 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 50° W.; desc. 10 ft. along W. slope.

7.30 An original line tree, a cedar, 36 ins. diam., mkd. with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

N. 0° 08' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 90 ft. over NW. slope.

3.40 Ravine, drains N. 80° W.; asc. 60 ft. over SW. slope, changing to W. slope.

11.60 Spur, slopes N. 70° W.; desc. 410 ft. over steep N. slope.
