T. 33 S., R 4 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A cedar, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 27° E., 8 lks. dist., with scribe marks T33S R4W CC visible on partially opened blaze. (Record, N. 22° E.)

A cedar, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 64° E., 8 lks. dist., with scribe marks T33S R4W S4 visible on partially opened blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 63° W., 33 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 34 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyors Office

A madrone, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 58° W., 22 lks. dist., with scribe marks 32S R4W S33 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

Descend 5 ft. over NE. slope.

25.78 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 4 W. (Seventh Standard Parallel South)

True point for the closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 46 3/4° E., 21 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T33S R4W S4 CC BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 57 1/4° W., 53 lks. dist., mkd. T33S R4W S5 CC BT.

From this point, the former standard cor. of secs. 32 and 33, changed to an angle point by Chapman and Nicklin, in 1897, bears N. 89° 38' E., 26.89 chs. dist., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy of T. 32 S., R. 4 W., executed concurrently under this same group.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, madrone, chinquapin, yew, and hemlock; undergrowth, ceanothus, manzanita, vine maple, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, fern, and young timber.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lines resurveyed are located in the mountainous area about 12 miles east of Glendale, Oregon, The elevation ranges from about 2700 feet above sea level on Grave Creek between sections 2 and 3, to about 4100 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of section 3 only, on the north boundary of the township. Access into the area is by way of improved roads leading up Grave Creek,
