A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears N. 17° W., 25 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Thence S. 89° 38' W., continue measurement on the S. bdy. of sec. 32.

Ascend 60 ft. over NE. slope.

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 45° E., 26 lks. dist., with partially opened and burned blaze, no marks visible.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 15° W., 45 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 4 BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 65 1/2° E., 27 lks. dist., with scribe marks S 1/4 C CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.
