 dist., with scribe marks T33S R4W visible on  
 weathered double blaze. (Record, S 77° E.,  
 16 lks.)

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 42 3/4° W., 40 lks.  
 dist., with healed double blaze. (Record,  
 S. 39° W.)

A fir snag, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 66° E., 38 lks.  
 dist., with scribe marks T33S R4W S6 CS BT  
 visible on weathered double blaze.

 dist., mkd. T33S R4W S6 CC BT.

S. 86° 28' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 15 ft. along N. slope, through heavy timber and
