43.50 Spur, slopes S. 70° W.; desc. 230 ft. over SW. slope.

49.80 Gravelled road, 30 lks. wide, bears NW. and S. 70° E., in curve.

59.865 The original closing cor. of secs. 33 and 34, perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyors Office, in 1970, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 30 ins. above ground, and in a mound of stone, 2 1/2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high with brass cap mkd. COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE DOUG CO T32S R4W CC S33 S34 S4 T33S JACKSON CO 1970, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A fir snag, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 37 1/2° W., 30 lks. dist., with scribe marks 32S R4W BT visible on burned blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by the County Surveyors Office

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 20° E., 15 lks. dist., with scribe marks S34 CC CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 4° W., 22 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks 33S R4W visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 66 lks. dist., with scribe marks T32S R4W S33 CC CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

Descend 5 ft. over S. slope of small spur.

60.22 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 4 W., (Seventh Standard Parallel South).

True point for the closing corner of secs. 33 and 34.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 41 1/2° E., 74 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T32S R4W S34 CC BT.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 28° w., 26 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T32S R4W S33 CC BT.

From this point, the former standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 33, changed to an angle point by Chapman and Nicklin, bears N. 89° 37' W., 8.635 chs. dist., hereinbefore described.
