A iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting  
5 ins. above ground, bears N. 75° E., 50 lks.  
dist., with brass cap mkd. T31S R7W S10 RM 1974  
and an arrow pointing to the corner.

An iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting  
5 ins. above ground, bears S. 75° W., 50 lks.  
dist., with brass cap mkd. T31S R7W S9 RM 1974  
and an arrow pointing to the corner.

N. 2° 24' W., bet. secs. 9 and 10.

Ascend 10 ft. over SW. slope, through moderate timber  
and undergrowth.

3.70 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 75° W.; asc. 130 ft. over  
SW. slope.

11.30 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 170 ft. over NW. slope.

23.10 Spring, 1 lk. wide, drains N. 10° W.; asc. 135 ft. over  
SW. slope.

36.10 Spur, slopes N. 20° W.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.

39.10 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 40 ft. over  
SW. slope.

44.90 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 10 ft. over NW. slope.

45.18 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, perpetuated and re-  
corded by John M. Powell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1966,  
monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set,  
projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

dist., with healed balze. (Record, N. 78° E.,  
39 lks.)

A root hole, bears S. 57° E., 28 lks. dist., with  
a down and decayed oak alongside, 8 ins. diam.,  
no marks visible.

A root hole, bears S. 32° W., 24 lks. dist., with  
a down and decayed oak alongside, size indeter-  
minate, no marks visible.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 8° W., 29 lks.  
dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 10° W.)
