GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located about 4 miles northwest of Riddle, Oregon. The area is drained by numerous creeks and seasonal drainages, the main one being Thompson Creek. The elevation ranges from about 1960 feet above sea level near the S 1/16 section corner of sections 5 and 6, to about 2800 feet above sea level near the NW 1/16 section corner of section 5.

Access into the area is gained by numerous gravelled and dirt logging roads.

Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, pine, madrone, oak, alder, chinquapin, and ash. The undergrowth is salal, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, fern, poison oak, blackberry, salmonberry, wild rose, and young timber.

The soil is composed of rocky clay, with scattered rock outcroppings. The only evidence of mineral activity noted was the Hanna Nickel Mine operation located in section 8.

The average of a considerable number of readings over the area gives a value of 19° 15' E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1/2° due to local attraction.
