CHAINS

From this point, a corner established and recorded by H. W. Lawrence, Registered Engineer, No. 1543, in 1960, bears S. 6° 14' W., 0.705 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, 3/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, from which a bearing tree mkd. by Lawrence:

A madrone, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 55 1/2° W., 19 lks. dist., with scribe marks WR 8 visible on partially healed blaze.

From cor. No. 5, Ruth Ruble Placer, Mineral Survey No. 234, perpetuated and recorded by H. W. Lawrence, Registered Engineer No. 1543, in 1964, monumented with an iron pipe, 1/2 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. RR 5 1543, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

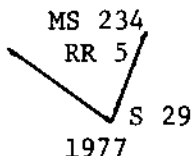
A sawed and decayed fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 7° W., 13 lks. dist., with a down and decayed fir log alongside, with scribe marks RR5 234 B visible on opened blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Lawrence

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 69 1/2° W., 18 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks RR5 BT visible on bark and a healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, directly over iron pipe, with brass cap mkd.



from which a new bearing tree

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 7° E., 83 lks. dist., mkd. MS 234 RR 5 BT.

N. 10° 29' E., on line 5-6 of Ruth Ruble Placer, Mineral Survey No. 234.

Ascend 15 ft. along W. slope, across old logged area, through young timber and dense undergrowth.

2.15 Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.

7.10 Foot of mountain, enter nearly level placer tailings, edge bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.

7.39 Point for cor. No. 6, Ruth Ruble Placer, Mineral Survey No. 234, determined by the grant boundary method; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
