CHAINS

The elevations in the area range from about 200 feet above sea level in the bottom lands along the Umpqua River to about 1,850 feet above sea level near the southeast corner of section 33. The soil is rocky clay loam. The timber stands are primarily composed of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, yew, chinquapin, and alder. The undergrowth is generally dense and consists of vine maple, hazel, poison oak, Oregon grape, salal, rhododendron, and ferns.

Numerous occupied dwellings are located in the bottom lands along the Umpqua River. No indication of mineral deposits was noted.

The average of a considerable number of readings along the lines surveyed gives a value of $20^{\circ}30'$ E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to $1^{\circ}30'$ due to local attraction.
