CHAINS

ins. above ground, mkd. with 2 notches and S26 on SE., and 2 notches and S26 1/2 on SW. faces, alongside of which is an iron pipe, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A sawed fir stump, size indeterminate, bears
S. 84 3/4° E., 66 lks. dist., with scribe marks
T2 R7 S26 BT visible on open blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Irving

A grand fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 16° E., 22 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 19 1/2° W., 24 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

From this point, the corner erroneously reported by Campbell as the Ford cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27, restored by him as the cor. of secs. 22 and 27 only, and changed to a witness point by Mensch, bears N. 0° 36' E., 2.03 chs. dist., determined at record bearing and distance from bearing trees mkd. by Campbell:

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 35 1/2° W., 30 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 31 1/2° W., 24 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

S. 89° 56' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 15 ft. over SE. slope.

3.00 Spur, slopes S. 40° W.; desc. 40 ft. over broken SE. slope.

7.18 Intersect the E. bdy. of sec. 27.

True point for the cor. of secs. 23 and 26 1/2 only.

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 71 1/2° E., 81 lks. dist., mkd. T29S R7W S26 1/2 BT.
