A twin cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 83 1/2° E., 51 lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R7W S2 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 59° E., 126 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 71° E., 105 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

I add marks AM to brass cap.

Timber, chinquapin, maple, ash, oak, madrone, fir, yew, alder, cedar, hemlock, pine, and dogwood; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, blackberry, salmonberry, thimbleberry, wild rose, willow, salal, Oregon grape, and young timber.
