	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located in mountainous country about 5 miles southwesterly from Winston, Oregon. The elevation ranges from about 800 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of sections 3 and 34 on the north boundary of the township, to about 2160 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 23, 24, 25, and 26.</p> <p>The area is drained by Olalla Creek and its tributaries. The soil consists of a rocky clay loam. The lands are forested with fir, hemlock, alder, cedar, pine, oak, maple, madrone, and chinquapin, ash, and yew. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, poison oak, rhododendron, salal, Oregon grape, huckleberry, salmonberry, wild rose, ceanothus, and fern.</p>
