The area is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 2000 feet above sea level near the angle point between sections 31 and 36 on the range line, to about 3250 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 24 and 25 only. The area is drained by Bull Run Creek and its tributaries and a number of tributaries of Starvout Creek.</p>
