CHAINS

Access is gained by way of several gravelled and dirt roads throughout the area.

The soil in the area is composed generally of rocky clay. Timber harvesting is the main use of the land in the area. Timber consists mostly of fir, with a dense stand of knobcone pine near the corner of sections 19, 20, 29 and 30. Some ponderosa pine, sugar pine, madrone, white oak, black oak, chinquapin, alder, maple, and yew are noted in a scattering quantity along the lines surveyed. Undergrowth consists chiefly of poison oak, ceanothus, huckleberry, thimbleberry, vine maple, salal, Oregon grape, and ferns.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed. An active rock quarry is located between the closing corner of sections 25 and 36 and the closing corner of sections 30 and 31, on the range line.

The average of a number of observations throughout the area gives a value of $19^{\circ} 45'$ East for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to $1^{\circ} 30'$ in local attraction.
