GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located in Douglas County about 8 miles southwesterly of the town of Elkton, Oregon.

Access into the area is via Camp Creek Road, Little Camp Creek Road, and Lutzinger Creek Road.

The land is mountainous, with elevations ranging from about 400 feet above sea level on the west boundary of section 31 to about 900 feet above sea level on the south boundary of section 31.
