<p style="text-align: center;"><b>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</b></p> <p>The lands included in this survey are located about 9 miles southwesterly from Riddle, Oregon. The area is drained by Doe Creek and Buck Creek, and various other tributaries which drain into Cow Creek. The elevations range from about 1,000 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 22, 23, 26, and 27, to about 2,400 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 27, 28, 33, and 34.</p> <p>Access is by way of the Cow Creek Road which is paved, and several gravelled and dirt roads throughout the area.</p> <p>Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, alder, chinquapin, and myrtle, with undergrowth of salal, rhododendron, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, ferns and grasses.</p> <p>Soil is composed of rocky clay and loam, with some large exposed boulders.</p> <p>No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the area covered by this resurvey.</p> <p>The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 3° in local attraction.</p>
