17.70	Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 25° W. and S. 25° E., also, bottom of descent, slopes S. 25° E.; asc. 120 ft. over SE. slope.
25.05	Spur, slopes S. 70° E.; desc. 20 ft. over SW. slope.
28.70	Ravine, drains S. 60° E.; asc. 180 ft. over NE. slope.
34.60	Spur, slopes S. 70° E.; asc. 100 ft. over SE. slope.
40.50	The cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, and yew; undergrowth, rhododendron, hazel, salmonberry, huckleberry, salal, and fern.

	Asc. 160 ft. over SE. slope, through moderate timber and heavy undergrowth.
6.75	Ridge, bears N. 25° E. and S. 25° W.; desc. 545 ft. over SW. slope.
11.60	Enter logged area, edge bears N. 80° W. and S. 70° E.
22.85	Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. and S. 20° W., in curve.
29.85	Smith Ridge Road, asphalt surface, 25 lks. wide, bears N. 70° W. and S. 80° E., in curve.
30.90	Ravine, drains S. 30° W.; asc. 60 ft. over SE. slope.
36.05	Smith Ridge Road, asphalt surface, 25 lks. wide, bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.
36.80	Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 40 ft. over SW. slope.
40.29	The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 18, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R.
