Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the West Boundary,  
T. 23 S., R. 8 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

**CHAINS**

(Restoring the survey by Williams R. Whipple,  
U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1894, the retracement by  
Oscar F. Thiel, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1898-99,  
and the dependent resurvey by James E. Jelley and  
Rolla R. Steward, Cadastral Surveyors, in 1969-70)

Beginning at the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 19 only, on the W.  
bdy. of T. 23 S., R. 8 W., monumented with an iron post,  
2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above  
ground, in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 6 ins. high,  
with brass cap mkd.

A roothole, bears N. 60° W., 33 lks. dist, with  
a downed fir alongside, 38 ins. diam., with  
scribe marks BT visible on opened blaze.

A hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 77° E., 57 lks.  
dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on  
partially healed blaze.

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 41 3/4° E.,  
57 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

N. 0° 09' E., on the W. bdy. of sec. 19, marking and  
blazing the true line.

Asc. 350 ft. over general S. slope, through heavy timber  
and moderate undergrowth.

8.85 Spur ridge, bears N. 30° E. and S. 30° W.; asc. 115 ft.  
along W. slope; also enter logged area, edge bears  
N. 20° E. and S. 70° W.

18.15 Ravine, drains S. 30° W.; asc. 80 ft. over S. slope.

20.44 The closing cor. of secs. 13 and 24, T. 23 S., R. 9 W.,  
monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set  
projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

visible on open blaze.
