

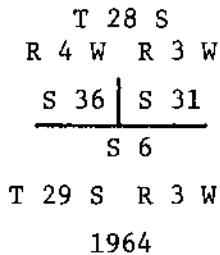

CHAINS

- 9.05 Spur, slopes S. 30° W.; desc. 165 ft. over W. slope.
- 17.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S. 20° W.; asc. 525 ft. over SE. slope.
- 39.51 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., no monument set.
- 39.90 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.
- 40.40 Ridge, bears N. and S.; desc. 65 ft. over broken W. slope.
- 45.44 The cor. of Tps. 28 S., Rs. 3 and 4 W., on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

N. 32° W., 39 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 48° E., 85 lks.
dist., with healed blaze.

A fir stump, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 50 3/4° W.,
67 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W., 24 lks.
dist., mkd. T28S R4W S36 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, hemlock, pine, oak, maple, yew, and alder; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, dogwood, blackberry, Oregon grape, thimbleberry, hazel, arrowwood, and young timber.
