- 27.45 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 95 ft. along broken E. slope.
- 34.55 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 15 ft. over NE. slope.
- 37.65 Ravine, drains S. 50° E.; asc. 45 ft. over SE. slope.
- 39.88 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, perpetuated and recorded by Ben B. Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1930, further perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 13 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A root hole, bears N. 50° E., 26 lks. dist., alongside of which is a fir, 18 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A root hole, bears S. 70° E., 28 lks. dist., alongside of which is a fir, 36 ins. diam., with healed blaze.

A fir, 37 ins. diam., bears S. 30° W., 34 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze; remarked by Irving with scribe marks R3W S BT visible on bark blaze. (Record, 31 lks.)

A fir, root crown, bears N. 80° W., 19 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 71° E., 55 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze.

A sugar pine, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 18° W., 63 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Byron

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 3° E., 87 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 29 ins. diam., bears N. 30° W., 18 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, myrtle, alder, chinquapin, and dogwood; undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, rhododendron, salal, ferns, and grasses.
