	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, dogwood, yew, and alder; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, rhododendron, ferns, and grasses.
	From the cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16, and 17. S. 89° 54' W., bet. secs. 8 and 17. Descend 175 ft. over W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
