

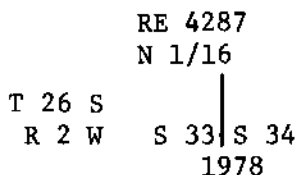

CHAINS

- 7.10 Ravine, drains S. 40° E.; asc. 235 ft. over SW. slope.
- 10.50 Enter logged area, edge bears S. 60° W. and N.
- 18.70 Enter moderate timber and undergrowth, edge bears S. and W.
- 20.04 The N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 33 and 34, established and recorded by Thomas E. Shrum, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 4287, in 1978, and is accepted as the cor., monumented with an iron pipe, 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 16 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 62 1/2° E., 28 1/2 lks. dist., with scribemarks N 1/16 S34 BT visible on open blaze.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 50° W., 18 lks. dist., with scribe marks N 1/16 S33 BT visible on open blaze.

Cor. is located on SW. cor. of a logged area, edge bears N. and E.

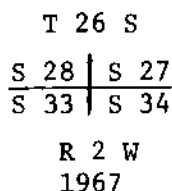
N. 0° 01' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 230 ft. over SW. slope, along W. edge of logged area and moderate undergrowth.

- 8.40 Ridge bears N. 85° W. and S. 75° E.; desc. 300 ft. over NW. slope. Gravelled road, 25 lks. wide, bears along top of ridge.

- 20.06 The cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, with brass cap mkd.

A hemlock stump, 27 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 26 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed original blaze, and scribe marks R2W S27 CS BT visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 29° E.)

A cedar stump, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 78° E., 20 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened original blaze, and scribe marks T26S R2W S34 CS BT visible on open blaze.
